REMNANT Purpose

REMNANT: noun, 1. a small part or number; 2. A surviving trace, a vestige.

The middle school Student Government (REMNANT) consists of 10 individuals who are reviewed by a committee of faculty and staff and elected by the middle school student body to serve a one-year term.

REMNANT's purpose is three-fold:

1. REMNANT provides leadership training, spiritual growth, and meaningful direction for middle school students.
2. REMNANT seeks to promote unity, spirit, pride, and ownership within the middle school.
3. REMNANT organizes and plans middle school activities, service opportunities, and special events, as well as serves at parent-related events when requested to do so.

Member Expectations

- All REMNANT members must be elected by a simple majority of the middle school student body.
- REMNANT meetings will be held every other Thursday morning from **7:00-7:40** in Room 248. Attendance is **required**.
- REMNANT members are required to perform the duties and roles of their respective positions.
- REMNANT members are required to act as role models for all MS students in the classroom, on the playing field, etc.
- REMNANT members must hold a **2.0 GPA** and have no failing grades in any subject required for graduation on any progress report or report card.
- REMNANT members are expected to display an attitude that is “the same as that of Jesus Christ” (Phil.2:5).

Officer Descriptions

REMNANT President (8th grade only)

“Leadership”

REMNANT President oversees all other REMNANT positions. The President meets monthly with the REMNANT lead advisor as well as the MS Principal to update both on REMNANT meetings, upcoming activities, and special events. The President is in charge of running REMNANT meetings, keeping order, and bringing leadership and excitement to MS activities.

REMNANT Vice-President (8th grade only)

“Service”

REMNANT Vice-President is “second in command” to the President. He/she assists the president and in the event that the REMNANT president is unable to perform his/her duties, the REMNANT Vice-President will assume his/her duties.

REMNANT Secretary (8th grade only)

“Communication”

REMNANT Secretary keeps record of meeting times and discussions. He/she also will coordinate information getting to the middle school via flyers, email, phone messages, posters, etc.

REMNANT Chaplain (8th grade only)

“Spiritual Growth”

REMNANT Chaplain provides spiritual growth and leadership for the middle school. The REMNANT Chaplain will work closely with the TMA Chaplain to plan chapels, spiritual emphasis days, and small groups. He/she will also open up REMNANT meetings with prayer/devotions.

Representative Descriptions

“Unity”

REMNANT will consist of two representatives from each grade. The REMNANT representatives will speak for their classes in REMNANT meetings, give input on specific class ideas, help plan major events, get necessary information to their respective classes, work with the REMNANT chaplain and school chaplain in planning MS chapels, and foster an atmosphere of excitement and unity for their class and the middle school as a whole.
